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ARTIST'S STATEMENT

There are too many places in the world. What makes one location distinct from any other? How do we know where we've been and where we're going? Photography has traditionally been used as a way to answer these questions. "I was there because I have this photograph." Or, "I've never been there, but it sure looks different from here."

My work focuses on the assumptions behind everyday statements such as these. I strive to capture the lived experience of discovering a place. I am also interested in the way photographs abstract space and time; how they can capture cycles of construction and deconstruction, and evidence of people living or just passing through. Together, the images present questions about cultural authenticity and what makes one location unique from any other.

Another larger theme in my work explores the nature of human perception and how unusual types of photomechanical reproduction can make us think about our world in a fresh way. A panoramic photo is not "more real" but simply gives a new facet on how to think about how we see.

This series focuses on Japanese urban industrial architecture. The pictures are composed of individual photographs, shot in sequence, and then stitched together. I love the poetic relationship presented by making art about the grand qualities of mundane buildings — especially in a large-scale, panoramic format. Layers of history are brought to life in this wide angle of view as the eye compares the relationship of buildings and the spaces between them. The viewer discovers unexpected juxtapositions and whimsical details.

BIOGRAPHY

Ari Salomon was born in Israel, raised in San Diego and now is based in San Francisco. He received a B.A. from U.C. Santa Cruz in 1993 in Art History with a focus on contemporary art theory and photography. He is both a photographer and a graphic designer. He is represented by the SFMOMA Artists Gallery and PHOTO Oakland.

SIZES AND EDITIONS

Sizes indicate image size without white border, not framed size. Framed prints are generally 3-6 inches wider and taller than image size. Most images are multi-sized limited editions of 5 for large images (7 or 8 feet) and 10 for small images (3 or 4 feet). All images are "Pigment Prints" printed on the Epson 7800 with Epson Ultrachrome K3 archival pigment inks. All images are available unframed at lower prices and can be shipped in a roll.

FRAMING

Images are printed with a white border and are mounted to gatorboard or tack-mounted to acid-free foamcore. Frames are matte black metal with standard plexiglass. Unframed price is shown in grey.


